

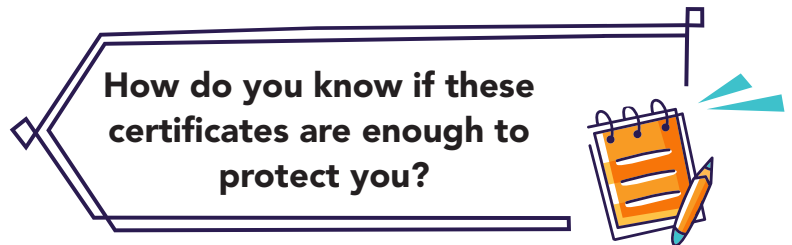


A QUICK GUIDE TO PRODUCT SAFETY
